I. Guest presentations

- a. Zilker Park soccer fields, Joanna Mesecke, Division Manager of the Central Parks department, Austin Parks and Recreation
 - i. Scope of Zilker project
 1. To get rid of the dust & trip hazards, and adding water fountains
 2. Irrigations system
 - a. Water from the lake (non-potable)
 - b. 319 sprinkler heads
 - c. Computerized
 - d. Will comply with water conservation efforts
 - e. No station will be watered more than twice a week
 3. Hearty turf grass
 - a. 3000 cubic yards of dillodirt
 - b. 46 acres of grass
 4. Granite gravel
 5. Upgrading telecom equipment
 6. Upgraded volleyball courts
 - a. Water fountain
 - b. Rinse shower
 - ii. \$2.5 Million
 1. Funded entirely by C3 Presents
 - iii. Hope to open park sometime in August for mixed-use
 - iv. Presentation on Parks site
- b. Austin Tree Survey, Shannon Leigh Halley, Urban Forestry Board
 - i. For mapping urban trees on non-city owned land
 - ii. "Citizen Foresters" will be trained to survey and report tree locations
 1. ~3 hours training module to be able to collect data on trees
 - iii. Release date: October (during Think Trees week)
 - iv. \$10,000 grant from Urban Forest

- v. Zilker Neighborhood can be its own “satellite”
- vi. Goal: to be able to factor the importance and \$\$ value of our trees into city planning
- vii. Shannon lives in Zilker, and would like to use the neighborhood for beta testing different projects

- c. Shady Grove parking variance, Paul Linehan, agent for the applicant
 - i. Asking for a variance from the additional 30 parking spaces they would need for a cocktail lounge permit, which would allow them to play at 85 decibels at their Thursday night concerts.
 - ii. Using the need to protect pecan trees in their existing parking lots as the hardship
 - iii. Scheduled for Board of Adjustments 7/13
 - iv. Linehan will get a letter with the conditions to the executive committee in the next few days, and we should plan on taking an e-mail vote early next week.
